

Five into One – Chapelshade Church



The origins of Chapelshade date from about the same time as those of the Gaelic Chapel. A relief chapel having been opened in 1789, the congregation was established as Chapelshade Church of Scotland in 1791. The third minister, the Rev. William Reid, led his members out at the time of the Disruption when Chapelshade Free Church began its life in Lindsay Street Chapel. A new church building was opened in 1848. Chapelshade seems to have suffered earlier than most from the over provision of churches in the central area and the retiral of the Rev. Alexander Adamson in 1915 led to a union with St. Andrew's.
